Join us at the Egypt Centrel Wales' largest collection of Egyptian antiquities!



We opened in 1998 and have two galleries you can visit with over 1000 objects on display dating back as far as 150,000 BC!

The majority of the artefacts we have on display were part of the collection of Sir Henry Wellcome, who is virtually unknown even though he was the most generous benefactor ever to British medical science.

We also have a number of objects donated to us and on loan from other institutions including The British Museum. The University of Wales Aberystwyth, and Woking College.

Discover what day to day life was like for the ancient Egyptians in the House of Life and explore their fascinating religious beliefs and funerary culture in the House of Death.

Free daily activities

As well as our amazing displays there are lots of free activities on offer. We have something for everyone, for children aged 3-103!

Become an embalming priest as you carry out a mummification using our 'dummy-mummy', or a royal scribe as you learn to write your name in Hieroglyphs.

We also have audio guides which offer further information on the highlights of the collection, colouring in activities, pyramid puzzles, themed trails and the chance to try on Egyptian style clothing.

You can also have a go at playing the ancient board game Senet, and even handle real ancient Egyptian artefacts including make up pots and beaded jewellery.



Have a go handling objects on the 'Materials Board' in the House of Life and discover what this is!

Although we have eager Gallery Assistants ready to demonstrate the hands-on activities some families may want more control over their learning. On offer we have a family Exploring Suitcase available to hire for just £1 for families to learn at their own pace.

Window Display



'Just a Catchy Title: On the History of Reception of the Ancient Egyptian Book of the Dead '.

Aris Legowski (University of Bonn, Germany)

Being one of the most attested sources of Ancient Egyptian literature, the chapters of the so called Book of the Dead could be expected to have received a fair amount of attention within the overall Egyptomania during the last centuries. Surprisingly, this is not the case.

Instead, this important text corpus has experienced some obscure and even unintended reception, which will be unravelled in this lecture.

'Mummies, Asps, and Far Too Much Eye Make-up: Ancient Egypt in the Cinema'.

John J. Johnston (University College London)

From the flickering Ten Commandments of the Silent Era through to the computer-generated spectacle of recent blockbusters, this talk considers, across a variety of genres, all of the major and many of the minor films, which have contributed, for over a century, to the public perception of ancient Egypt.

March 9 ways to write 7 languages Thesday 3rd

This workshop explores the development of writing in the Near East, from cuneiform and hieroglyphs to Greek, Latin and Arabic.

You will get the chance to handle some real ancient artefacts that are usually on display and view others in our two galleries looking specifically at examples of nine scripts or alphabets used in Egypt to write seven different languages.

We will also explore the function of writing in Ancient Egyptian society: as a powerful tool of religion and politics as well as a method of recording important events and daily needs. Without writing, our knowledge of the history, culture and religion of Ancient Egypt would be severely diminished.

This workshop is created and led by linguist Dr Dulcie Engel, who volunteers at the Egypt Centre.



In 2013, an unassuming fragment of a seated statue in Manchester Museum was re-identified as belonging to Senenmut the highest courtier of Queen Hatshepsut. This lecture reviews the significance of the Manchester piece in the context of Senenmut's other representations, and reflects on the extraordinary degree to which Senenmut wished to be commemorated for eternity.

Magic of Mummies!


This Easter, explore the ancient Egyptian belief in rebirth and discover the magic of mummies as you step back in time and become ancient Egyptians for the day!

Starting from only 5p, we have quizzes, trails and family exploring activities!


We also have do-it-yourself craft sheets where you can make your own Senet board game and counters, Canopic jar and even your very own mummy mask!

Volunteering Adult Volunteering

You can meet new friends, learn new skills, get on a career path, and have the satisfaction of helping run Wales' only museum of ancient Egypt!



The adult volunteer program runs Tuesday - Friday, 10am - 4pm and is open to anyone over the age of 18.

We rely on volunteers to maintain our galleries, ensuring the gallery is safe and clean and that all equipment is working. Volunteers talk to our visitors, welcome them, answer enquiries and give guided tours.

They can also work as educational leaders for visiting school groups and are closely involved with the development of hands-on activities with the Education Officer. We have also recently introduced some new roles, including administration assistants who help with the basic day to day admin of the Museum.

We have special free training events for you including the opportunity to handle artefacts normally only on display behind glass and even some that are usually kept in storage!

Volunteering Young Volunteering

Anyone over the age of 10 can volunteer. You don't need to know anything about ancient Egypt, or museums, but you do need an interest in history and heritage, and like working with lots of different people!

As a young volunteer you will become a Gallery Assistant. This means you will be looking after galleries, talking with visitors and demonstrating our hands-on activities, such as mummification, to visitors. We also have special classes specially for you, including ones where you get the opportunity to handle some of the objects in the cases.

The young volunteer programme runs each Saturday from 10 am-4 pm.

No other museum in the country is run by young people so completely!


